VRC gives up powers

Whangarei's Totara Park Stud has secured dual Gr III-winning El Prado stallion Buffalo Man for stud duties this year.

Six-time North American stakes winner Buffalo Man will stand alongside Rusty Spur at \$6500 plus GST.

Studmaster Dirk Oberholster was delighted to get the Canadian-bred sire, who was touted as a Kentucky Derby prospect after winning five of his first seven starts, including three straight at Listed level before he fractured a fetlock and was sidelined.

He returned as a turf horse with Gr III wins in the Red Banks Stakes and Appleton

Stakes and retired with a record of eight wins from 23 starts over distances of 1000m to 1700m.

Oberholster said Totara Park had been searching for the right stallion for the past two years and Buffalo Man perfectly fitted the bill.

"He is well-performed, not only showing early form but the ability to race on," Oberholster said.

"He provides massive sire power within his pedigree and ran exceptionally fast race times, had a devastating turn of foot and the courage to finish the job off."

"He's physically a good-looking, strong, well-balanced horse, has a great temperament and a female family full of black-type."

falo Man was a stakes-winning two-year-old and is by champion two-year-old and emerging sire of sires El Prado out of multiple stakes-winning and Gr I-placed two-year-old Perfect Six, by Saratoga Six.

Kentucky Derby-winning trainer Cam Gambolati said of Buffalo Man: "He is one of my all-time favourite horses. If he

doesn't become a successful stallion, nothing will."

El Prado is the sire of two of the hottest young sires in America - Kittens Joy and Medaglia D'Oro, the sire of the United States horse of the year Rachael Alexandra.

Medaglia D'Oro has been purchased by Darley and will stand at Darley Australia in 2010.

The Victorian Racing Club (VRC) has put a stop to potential controversy by ending the board's discretionary powers to elevate a horse into the Melbourne Cup field out of balloting order.

New wording has been included into the race conditions stating if a horse in the top 24 of the Melbourne Cup order of entry is eliminated at the discretion of directors then the balloting of surplus horses will continue in ballot order.

The ruling formalises the VRC board's approach in this area in recent years, meaning horses will not be selected or promoted into the Melbourne Cup field from outside of the normal ballot order.

Should a horse be eliminated by the VRC board, the horse at number 25 in the order of entry would become the new number 24 horse but will be subjected to the same scrutiny as the horses above it and so forth.

The VRC has altered the wording of its discretionary balloting clauses to only exempt horses from the Melbourne Cup ballot who have won a ballot-exempt race in 2010 or the winner of this year's Australian Stayers' Challenge.

The VRC on Wednesday announced these and other modifications to the qualifying conditions for the 150th running of the iconic race.

Three international staying events, the San Juan Capistrano and the Arlington Million in the United States, and the Doncaster Cup in England, have lost their ballot-exempt status to the winners.

The winner of the Gr I Turnbull Stakes will now automatically pass the first clause of balloting with the VRC board aligning the performance to a second or third placing in the Mackinnon Stakes.

"The VRC acknowledges the need to continue to innovate when setting the conditions for the Emirates Melbourne Cup each year," chief executive Dale Monteith said.

"If changes are needed to ensure that this great race offers the maximum level of fairness to all entrants, while delivering the best available field to the event, then the VRC board will act accordingly, and it has done just this in respect of the 2010 Melbourne Cup."

"The club has consulted closely with RVL management and its chief handicapper Greg Carpenter in this regard."

Meanwhile, emergencies will not be introduced for the 2010 Melbourne Cup.

"Although we understand the popular view is to include emergencies we believe that it would introduce additional complexity for our customers that would have a negative impact on wagering on our biggest race," Racing Victoria Limited (RVL) chief executive Rob Hines said.

Hines said analysis indicated that there would be no impact on turnover if there were fewer than 24 Melbourne Cup runners, provided there were more than 20 runners.

Eagle set to land at Brighthill

Hong Kong Cup-winning stallion Eagle Mountain is set to land at Tauwhare's Brighthill Farm for the new breeding season.

Brighthill's Nick and Anne Marie King have been able to piggyback off the encouraging start Perfectly Ready has made to his stud career from their Waikato farm with the announcement they have secured the Rock Of Gibraltar stallion.

Nick King said Eagle Mountain's owner Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum had an interest in Perfectly Ready and was "very positive and encouraged by the experience".

Sheikh Mohammed will retain a 60 per cent stake in Eagle Mountain and the remaining shares will be available to New Zealand breeders.

"He is very confident in the direction of the New Zealand industry and this is the second stallion he is involved in," King said.

Eagle Mountain, who will stand at \$12,000 plus GST, raced in six countries and was three times a Group winner before his best win in the Gr I Hong Kong Cup (2000m) at Sha Tin in 2008.

In 19 starts in all, Eagle Mountain won five races and was placed a further eight times, including second placings in the Breeders' Cup Turf, English Derby and Champion Stakes and a third placing in the Irish Derby.

"He was an outstanding racehorse around the world and we're delighted to have the opportunity to offer him to New Zealand breeders," King said.

"He was an extremely talented galloper and diverse - he won in top company from 1200m to 2100m and was also placed in two Derbies."

Eagle Mountain also has the distinction of holding the track record over the famed Rowley Mile course at Newmarket when he posted 1.34.07 to win the Gr III Joel Stakes.

He began his career under champion Irish trainer Aidan O'Brien, winning at The Curragh at his second start at two before placing in the Gr II Futurity and Champagne Stakes, and winning the Gr II Beresford Stakes.

He resumed at three with a

game fifth in the 24-horse Gr I 2000 Guineas at Newmarket before his English Derby second and Irish Derby third.

From there he progressed his three-year-old season with a narrow win in the Gr II Royal Whip Stakes and a second placing in the Gr I Champion Stakes at Newmarket, beaten a short head by Literato.

At the end of his classic year, Eagle Mountain was named Ireland's champion middle-distance three-year-old.

He was subsequently purchased by Sheikh Mohammed

Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum and he only raced on three further occasions, retiring after finishing second at Meydan in Dubai in February.

De Kock rated Eagle Mountain the equal of any horse he had trained, high praise indeed from one of the world's premier horsemen.

"Eagle Mountain is arguably the best horse that I have ever trained," he said.

"He possessed amazing speed, whether he was running six furlongs [1200m] or 10 furlongs [2000m] - he was always com-

petitive against the best horses in the world."

King was at his Eagle Mountain's swansong racetrack performance in Dubai and was impressed with what he saw.

"I went to Dubai to see him during the international meeting and met Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum and it was a fantastic experience," King said.

"I was really impressed with the horse - he's a balanced type at just 16 hands and very athletic and correct with a great head.

"It's easy to see why he was such a versatile racehorse who won at two and had the ability to star at a mile and further in the very best company."

Eagle Mountain is a half-brother to four winners, including Gr I winner and champion French two-year-old Sulk, out of the winning Darshaan mare Masskana, herself a daughter of the Gr I French 1000 Guineas winner Masarika.

Eagle Mountain will stand alongside Perfectly Ready and Patapan at Brighthill next spring.

Sceptics remain as Victorian jumps racing returns

New hurdles and steeplechases have given jockeys and trainers renewed optimism as a watershed Victorian jumps racing season gets underway this weekend, but opponents believe nothing will change.

After being banned last November following the deaths of 17 horses in the 2008 and 2009 seasons, Racing Victoria Limited (RVL) gave jumps racing a reprieve in January on several conditions - including new obstacles.

But the sport is still on notice, with the RVL reserving the right to ban it again if there is an unacceptably high number of falls and deaths.

The RVL says the sport's entire future relies on what happens over the next four months.

With the season already delayed by 11 days, it opens quietly with the Hamilton Cup two-day meeting staging four jumps races with small fields.

There were only five acceptors for the Maiden Steeplechase and

six for the Maiden Hurdle today, while eight accepted for the feature Eulong Steeple and six for tomorrow's the Lanyons Hurdle.

Australian Jumps Racing Association president Rodney Rae puts that down to uncertainty surrounding the sport.

There was a hold-up to the season with the RVL awaiting a shipment from France of the new brown brush for jumps which is widely used in Europe.

"Due to the uncertainty and the late start we knew we'd struggle

for numbers, at least for the first few weeks," Mr Rae said.

RVL has spent \$A600,000 on 90 new jumps units and the 2010 jumps programme offers a total of \$A2,335,000 in prizemoney spread over 63 jumps events.

The season will run over four-and-a-half months with meetings to be held at seven specialist jumps tracks - Sandown, Coleraine, Casterton, Hamilton, Moe, Pakenham and Warrnambool.

Jumps racing was suspended after three horses were killed at

last year's three-day Warrnambool May carnival and the RVL announced in November that 2010 would be its last season.

After much negotiation, the RVL offered the sport a lifeline in January, including among its conditions that certain standards be reached in regards to field sizes and betting turnover.

If jumps racing performs well this season it will continue in 2011 and, if next season is also successful, it will go on beyond that.

But not if animal welfare groups get their way.

"They've been trying to fix up the jumps for the last 20 years and they've failed each and every time," said Elio Celotto, campaign manager for the Coalition for the Protection of Racehorses.

"Our position is that the jumps can't be made safe just like you can't make drinking and driving safe. They just aren't compatible and horses will fall and they will die this year no matter what they do."

"RVL's plans with the new jumps are just another reprieve that will end up in disaster and I'm sure they'll find they'll end up in the same position as they were in last year."

RVL chief executive Rob Hines conceded last season and the year before that were "awful" but the targets had been achieved the previous year.

"This is a landmark season for jumps racing. The future of the sport will be decided over the next four months," Mr Hines said. AAP
